Our society continues to develop with activities related to both the society and Pandemifonden. Summer is here and with this we arrange the19th (!) Smögen Summer Symposium on Virology, with excellent keynote speakers, and two joint venture courses in clinical and molecular virology. We look very much forward to meet, talk science and mingle. Business as usual!

The board is very happy to announce additional financial support to Pandemifonden from e.g. The Knut and Alice Wallenberg Foundation (3 MSEK year 2022-2024) and a very generous private donation (1 MSEK)! This allows us to continue the development of the Pandemifonden and build further on the Sigvard Olofsson award that was initiated last year (more of the latter will follow during the fall). We also have plans to develop a knowledge portal on the Pandemifonden web page and SoMe, which will help us to communicate knowledge and impact of virus-caused illnesses. "Crew Pandemifonden", a group of engaged volunteers/young virologists have recently been formed, and they have exciting ideas about how to promote Pandemifonden and our common goals. The work with the Society Advisory Board continues with regular meetings, sharing of knowledge and experiences and ideas for further developments and activities. Pandemifonden will also participate at Almedalen in July where we will do our best to share knowledge about virus-caused diseases and develop our network.
