Dear Members of SSV,

It was that time of the year again—the annual Smögen meeting, the heart of SSV.

This year, we also organized a course for PhD students and postdocs, focusing on viral pathogenesis. We were fortunate to have 19 students from various parts of Sweden and even some from Germany. Since this past spring, we have initiated a partnership with the German-speaking Society for Virology, which paves the way for more intensive and close collaboration between our organizations. As many of you may have noticed from our newsletters, invitations have been circulating to participate in various webinars and activities organized by our German counterparts, specifically aimed at our PhD students and postdocs. We were also privileged to host two German senior virologists as guest lecturers during the course. Our students have been invited to attend the German annual meeting in March in Hamburg at the same rate as German students. We strongly encourage everyone to seize this opportunity! I would also like to extend a big thank you to all the lecturers and course organizers, Johan Nordgren and Linn Persson Berg, for their outstanding and exemplary work.

As always, the Smögen meeting ran smoothly, mainly thanks to the fantastic work of Kristina Nyström, featuring two excellent keynote speakers (unfortunately, the third was unable to attend due to illness). It is always incredibly gratifying to witness the breadth and depth of research being conducted across the country, from north to south. Once again, we were thoroughly impressed—and reminded—of how talented our young scientists, PhD students and postdocs, are, particularly in presenting their data concisely and effectively in just seven minutes. The two 2023 Pandemifonden Awardees, Max Renner, Umeå, and Jiaxin Ling, Uppsala, also gave excellent presentations on their research. These Pandemifonden prizes have been awarded thanks to a very generous donation by professor emerita Eva-Maria Fenyö. A warm thanks to her and everyone who donates!
